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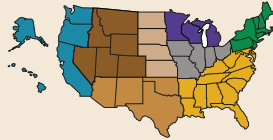

FISH & WILDLIFE ANNOUNCES ENDANGERED SPECIES CANDIDATES.

In October, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service identified three new candidate species for protection under the Endangered Species Act. They are the bracted twistflower, a Texas flower found primarily in the Austin area; the Poweshiek skipperling, a butterfly found in the upper Midwest; and the magnificent ramshorn, a snail found in North Carolina. In addition, three species were removed from the candidate list: the Wekiu bug, which lives atop Hawaii's Mauna Kea volcano, and the Gila and the New Mexico springsnails.

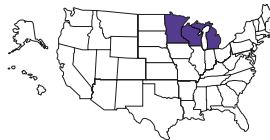

TEXAS OIL AND GAS FIRM BUYS 18,000 ACRES. A subsidiary of Ultra Petroleum (UPL) paid a U.S. Bankruptcy Court \$20 million in October to acquire 18,000 acres of the Banning Lewis Ranch on the eastern edge of Colorado Springs. The Banning Lewis acquisition is only one of several for Ultra in the area. This summer the company paid \$1.67 million to Denver-based Pine Ridge Oil & Gas for leases on nearly 100,000 acres of land in eastern El Paso County.

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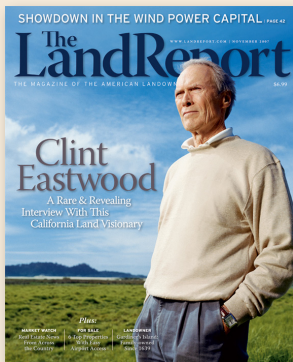

3,379 ACRES IN BOONE COUNTY GO TO AUCTION ON NOV. 19. **Schrader Real Estate & Auction Company** will manage the sale of the 48 tracts, which total some 2,900 tillable acres. "It's possible that we will have some large investors seeking to purchase substantial amounts of land, but local farmers and investors seeking 100 acres or less will have an equal chance to buy the land they want," says R.D. Schrader. Located five miles east of Rockford, the tracts range in size from 2± acres to more than 200 acres and will be available for the 2012 crop year.

KELLEY ACQUIRES I-65 ACREAGE.

The nation's fourth largest private landowner bought 322 contiguous acres on the west side of I-65. His brother Kent bought 190 acres on the east side of I-65. The Kelleys paid \$3.23 million or approximately \$6,300 per acre. Six years ago, local entrepreneur David Garvin paid from \$4,500 to \$9,000 per acre to assemble a total of 965 acres, which are located six miles north of the Kentucky-Tennessee border. The land receives a daily traffic count of 42,000, offers two and a half miles of interstate frontage, and is zoned B-5 Interstate Interchange Business District. Sixteen registered bidders competed for the properties, which were auctioned by **J.P. King Auction Company**.
